CEO GEORGE MCCANN, PRESIDENT AND CAO ANTHONY "SKIP" CIMINO TO RETIRE; MARK DAMIANO PROMOTED TO COO

MANALAPAN, NJ – APRIL 2, 2009 – CMX, a national engineering and consulting firm, announced a number of executive changes today which are designed to streamline the organization and position the company for future growth.

George G. McCann, the Chief Executive Officer of CMX, announced that he intends to step down in the next few months to spend more time with his family. Mr. McCann stated that an executive search firm will be retained to assist CMX in recruiting a senior executive with both public and private sector engineering expertise. Kevin Kuykendall, a member of the Board of Directors, praised Mr. McCann for his 15 years of leadership at CMX. "George has devoted his career into building CMX into a premier engineering and consulting firm with a national footprint. We deeply appreciate his willingness and desire to lead this organizational transition and ensure the future prosperity of CMX."

Anthony J. "Skip" Cimino, President and Chief Administrative Officer of CMX, also announced his retirement after 15 years of dedicated service to the firm. Mr. McCann said, "Skip was instrumental in the strategic growth of our brand and shaped our marketing and sales departments. I would like to thank Skip for the leadership and devotion he has shown through his career with the Company."

Mr. McCann also announced the promotion of Mark Damiano to Chief Operating Officer of CMX, effective immediately. "Mark's entrepreneurial experience, leadership in the telecom engineering market, broad-based experience in a variety of engineering disciplines, and ability to drive significant change make him uniquely qualified to lead CMX through this organizational transition. He brings tremendous energy and a growth orientation to the Firm. Both CMX and our clients will benefit from Mark's future leadership." Mr. Damiano joined CMX in 2005 upon the Company's acquisition of Damiano Long Consulting Engineers, Inc., a private engineering firm with 52 people in five offices in four states that he co-founded with his partner Kenneth P. Long.

Dennis P. McConnell, current Chief Operating Officer of CMX, also will retire in order to pursue personal interests. Mr. McCann said, "Dennis has been an integral part of the

growth and success of our Company, both as CFO and as COO. He was instrumental in leading the Company's response to the tumultuous markets of the last few years, and the Company is indebted to him for his efforts."

LuAnn Centanni, Director of Human Resources, will also retire from the firm after a 33 year career with the Company. Mr. McCann said, "LuAnn has been a key executive of our organization for over three decades, where she rose from clerk to become the first female Principal of the firm. She has shaped, driven, and integrated our human resource policies, and the company thanks her for her service."

In addition, the Company announced that Mr. Long had been promoted to the newly-formed position of Group Head of Business Development and Marketing.

Mr. Damiano said, "I appreciate the contributions that all of the retiring executives have made in developing one of the premier engineering and consulting firms in our markets. I believe that the executive changes will allow us to continue to lead CMX through what will be a difficult year in 2009. As the U.S. economy struggles to recover, we want to ensure that the strong franchise of CMX is positioned both to weather the immediate storm and to be prepared for the stimulus-led opportunities we forecast for 2010. We believe these changes will serve as the foundation for the continued transformation of CMX into an even more successful organization."
