### **CMX COMMUNITY FOUNDATION HELPS WEST ESSEX FIRST AID SQUAD ACHIEVE BUDGET GOAL FOR NEW EMERGENCY TRUCK**

**MANALAPAN, NJ – MAY 5, 2009** – The CMX Community Foundation (CMXCF), dedicated to benefiting the company’s immediate and neighboring communities, recently gave a grant to the West Essex First Aid Squad (WEFAS). CMXCF’s \$1,500 grant was allocated to assist in funding a new emergency rescue truck for WEFAS, founded in 1937.

“Grants such as these are the reason we started the CMX Community Foundation,” said Patrice Malleus, Chair, Board of Trustees for the CMX Community Foundation. “There is a need in this community, and we have the opportunity to help the WEFAS acquire the equipment that is absolutely essential to their mission.” Since 1987 WEFAS has been using one truck to provide emergency and rescue services to Caldwell, Essex Fells, Fairfield, North Caldwell and West Caldwell. These towns, according to the 2000 census, have a population exceeding 35,000. WEFAS’ jurisdiction also includes major stretches of Routes 46 and 80. CMXCF’s Community Grant helped the squad to acquire an updated truck with the most recent technology.
